The 2023 event will take place on Tuesday 12 and Wednesday 13 September. Every eight or ten guest yacht comes with a professional crew alongside safety gear and a safety briefing on the first day of the event.

John Holt, head of sixth form and leader of the Sailing Club at Greig City Academy said: "To be chosen again as one of the Silicon Cup's sponsored charities this year is an honour. The support enables us to offer more sailing opportunities to the younger students from the innercity catchment area of London. The younger years are just beginning their adventure and welcome the ability to now go sailing every week, something they did not have access to before."

A gala dinner will also be held on the first night at Cowes on the Isle of Wight, with competitions and auctions held to raise money for the chosen charities.

Sally Turner, the partnerships, marketing and communications manager at The Andrew Simpson Foundation said: "The support from the Silicon Cup Regatta has enabled young people to get out on the water, gain accredited qualifications and develop key life skills. The funds raised from last year's Silicon Cup Regatta enabled the ASF to support over 4,500 young people in 2022 alone."
